Once you have your book open, hover your cursor over the text you'd like to highlight. Click on the text and drag the cursor to the end of the text that you'd like to be highlighted.

The options include different colour choices and the ability to make a note alongside your highlighted text

Once you have released the mouse, various options will appear.
